#### **Lombardy North Western**

It includes 51 clubs, for a total of approximately 2,000 members.



#### **Lombardy South West**

District 2050 was born with the subdivision of District 204 into 204 and 205 carried out in the year 1985/1986. District 205 – which then took on the name 2050 in 1991/1992 – was assigned the current provinces of Brescia, Cremona, Lodi, Mantua, Pavia, Piacenza and some municipalities in the province of Milan.

From the initial 33 clubs, the District grew to 42 in 1990, but in the following year 10 clubs from the Milan area were transferred from Evanston to District 2040. Starting from the 32 remaining clubs, in the space of ten years the District grew to 55 club, but - again - in 2000 4 clubs in the Milan area moved to 2040 (without alteration of the district territory). In thirteen years, 24 new clubs were formed, reaching 75, but in 2013 another ten clubs in the Milan area and related territories were removed from District 2050.



#### **OUR HISTORY**

gave free rein to their innovative and creative ability, while supporting the growth of their territory, the well-being of the population who lived there and the development of the related industries, could not fail to find confirmation in the project of ethical training foresight that was taking shape on both sides of the ocean through the birth of "Clubs" dedicated to social issues. In fact, from the very beginning of 1928 contacts intensified between those who felt strongly and clearly the feeling of knowing how to make this message their own, take up the baton and become promoters of the birth of a Rotary Club of Varese. The first meeting of the founding group thus took place on 30 April 1928 as stated in report no. 1 reported as an attachment at the bottom. The request for membership in Rotary International was sent. The Rotary Club of Varese was recognized as a full member of Rotary International on 16 September 1928, one year after the birth of the province of Varese, already known as the garden city, and five after the foundation of the first Italian Rotary Club, in Milan. The first president was Ermenegildo Trolli, a prestigious footwear industrialist, who would still preside over the club when the activity resumed, interrupted in 1938 by order of the fascist regime. In over seventy years of existence, our Rotary has included members who have contributed to the industrial, economic, scientific and cultural growth of the country: in addition to Ermenegildo Trolli we remember Giulio Macchi, founder of the Macchi Air Force; Giovanni Borghi famous, "white" entrepreneur with his Ignis and great sporting patron; Scipione Riva Rocci, world-famous doctor and scientist, inventor of the device for measuring blood pressure; the Italianist Dante Isella; Piero Chiara, a very fine writer, ending in the present day with Alfredo Ambrosetti who calls together the international economic and financial elite at Villa d'Este in Cernobbio, and Ermanno Bazzocchi, who is a leading designer in the aeronautical field, his will be the first jet trainers of our air forces with the MB326, modernized a few years later to enter with the name of MB339 to equip the Italian aerobatic team "the arrows tricolori".

In one of the most industrialized areas of Northern Italy at the time, where entrepreneurs and freelancers

## PARTNER PROGRAM

Our first destination is the historical center of Varese, the "garden city", where walking along the streets, we can admire not only monuments and important places such as Palazzo Estense, Piazza del Podestà and Piazza San Vittore, but also secret and hidden corners such as small cloisters and courtyards, turrets, windows and residential arches of the past.

The tour continues in Sacro Monte, one of the UNESCO sites of the territory, a religious complex built on the mount of Velate during the XVII century and composed by 14 Chapels, the Shrine and the Crypt. We reach the small village by the funicolar railway and, after a walk along the streets, we visit the Casa Museo Pogliaghi, the private home of Lodovico Pogliaghi, the artist from Milan who projected also the central door of Duomo. Inside, an international collection of artwork and archaeological remains is preserved.

The tour finishes with tasting the famous Elixir Al Borducan, a local liquor. The last day our visit is dedicated to Villa e Collezione Panza in Varese, a 18th century villa surrounded by a magnificent Italian garden that hosts one of the foremost collections of contemporary art and international exhibitions. Dan Flavin, James Turrel and Robert Irwin are only three of the many artists at Villa and Collezione Panza. It's not only a must-see for art lovers, but a really unique and unexpected place for wonderful pictures and for a day off from Milan.
